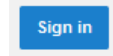




Uploading a Caption/Subtitle file to YouTube

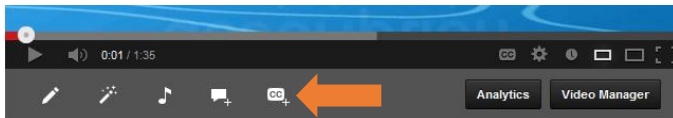
1. Sign into the YouTube account of the video's owner. (You can't add captions to someone else's video without their username and password.)

Click on the video you want to caption, which will take you to that video's page.

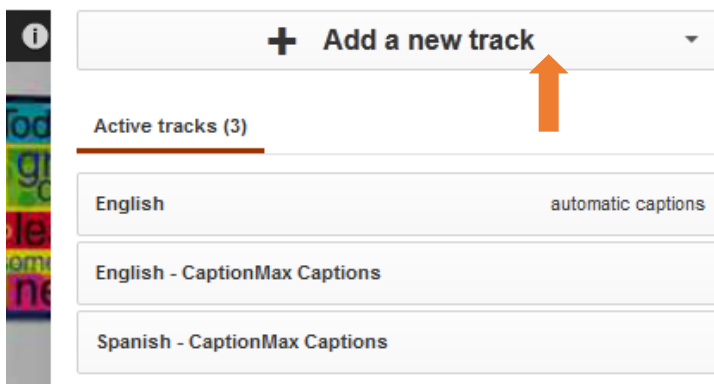


2. At the bottom of the video playback window, you will see a CC icon with a plus sign.

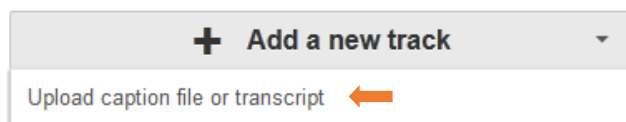
This is the Add Captions icon. Click on that.



3. It will bring you to a screen with an **Add a new track** button on the right side of the screen, where there will also be a list of any current caption tracks.



4. Click on **Add a new track** and select **Upload caption file or transcript**.





5. Select the track language, choose a track name if you wish, and then click the **Upload timed caption file** button. An actual timed caption file is going to be higher quality than automatic captions or an auto-synced transcript.

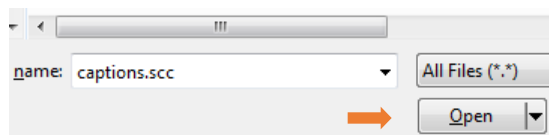

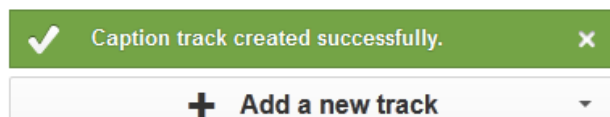

6. Navigate to your scc or srt file and click **Open**.
